From steakhouse to Shake Shack, Oklahoma City welcomes slate of new restaurants this month

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From a Korean-steak hot spot to the city's very first Shake Shack, November has brought a fresh wave of flavors to the Oklahoma City metro area.

[Shake Shack](#) made its long-awaited Oklahoma debut Nov. 19 at the OAK development, adding burgers, shakes and community buzz to the mix. Meanwhile, in the Uptown District, Local chef Kevin Lee has made waves with MAHT, an upscale Korean-American steakhouse.

Here's a look at new restaurants that opened recently in Oklahoma City:

Bar None

Located at 801 N. Hudson Ave. in the space that was previously Nonesuch's private dining space, [Bar None](#) will bring to life a concept long-discussed and envisioned by operating partner Chad Luman and assistant general manager Kiki Mackey.

The bar's focus is on North American wine, featuring both bottle service and wine by the glass, with selections carefully curated to bring wines from areas of the continent people may not normally consider, like Mexico and Canada.

Mountain Mike's Pizza

[Mountain Mike's](#), a Palo Alto California-based chain, opened its first Oklahoma location at 5855 SE 15th St. in Midwest City in November. It's the first of several Mountain Mike's stores planned for the state by local franchisees Jesse & Mona Kang.

The Midwest City location will feature an all-you-can-eat pizza and salad bar, kids' arcade and big-screen TVs for game days.

MAHT

Chef Kevin Lee is opening his newest restaurant, [MAHT](#), located at 519 NW 23 St, Suite 111. The restaurant combines Lee's Korean heritage while also recognizing it as an American steakhouse.

The menu includes several seafood options like tuna taki and sweet shrimp crudo and crab legs with various beefs and lamb chops, all sandwiched together by Parker House rolls and whipped potatoes.

Shake Shack at OAK

[Shake Shack's](#) first location in Oklahoma opened on Nov. 19 at [OAK](#), the upscale northwest Oklahoma City shopping district that is also home to Capital Grille and Tommy Bahama Marlin Bar.

The fast-growing gourmet burger chain started in New York City will open in a prominent, all-glass, jewel box-shaped building fronting Heartwood Park at the mixed-use development. The chain is known for its made-to-order 100% Angus beef burgers, crispy chicken sandwiches, hand-spun shakes and house-made lemonades.
